NURSE A SCHOOL ACTIVITY

St.Stephen Grammar School, Ondo

This month, we are excited to highlight the impactful work HFN is doing through the Nurse A School (NAS) program, reaching communities across several partner states. The NAS initiative continues to make a meaningful difference by delivering essential healthcare education and support, helping to improve lives at the grassroots level.

During the recent Health Club meeting at St.Stephen Grammar School, Ondo, students participated in an engaging and educational session on the topic of balanced diets. The session focused on helping students understand the importance of eating the right mix of foods to support their growth, concentration, and overall well-being.

Nurse Makinde explained the five major food groups and their nutritional value, emphasizing the need for variety and moderation in daily meals. Students also learned how maintaining a balanced diet can boost energy levels, strengthen the immune system, and enhance academic performance. The session encouraged greater awareness of their eating habits and highlighted the importance of making healthier food choices for overall well-being.

NURSE A SCHOOL ACTIVITY

Ekunle High School 2, Iseyin

During a morning assembly at Ekunle High School 2, Iseyin, students participated in an enlightening health talk on malaria and its prevention. The session aimed to educate them on the causes, symptoms, and practical steps to prevent one of Nigeria's most prevalent and serious public health challenges.

Students gained valuable knowledge to protect themselves and their communities against the disease.

Nurse Adesina explained how malaria is transmitted through mosquito bites and discussed key symptoms such as fever, chills, headache, and body weakness. Emphasis was placed on preventive strategies, including sleeping under insecticide-treated nets, eliminating stagnant water, and maintaining clean surroundings to reduce mosquito breeding.

To reinforce learning and assess students' understanding, a quiz was held at Bashorun Ojoo High School in Ibadan, covering all the topics previously discussed during Health Club sessions. This re-evaluation highlighted key areas of knowledge retention and sparked active participation among the students.

Community Comprehensive High School, Awo-Ekiti, Ekiti

Nurse Abiodun Mercy of Community Comprehensive High School, Awo-Ekiti, Ekiti State, led an engaging health education session during the school's Health Club meeting, focusing on Soil-Transmitted Helminths (STHs), a group of intestinal parasites commonly spread through contaminated soil.

The session aimed to raise awareness about how these infections occur, their health impacts, and effective prevention strategies. Emphasis was placed on key practices such as regular handwashing, wearing footwear, using clean toilets, and maintaining proper hygiene.

Students participated actively and left the session better informed and empowered to protect themselves and their communities from these preventable infections.
