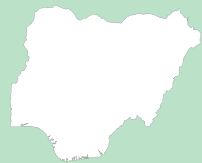
12 School Sickbays Established

Community Engagement Report – Araromi Community, Elebu Oja, Ibadan

On Saturday, September 6, 2025, Health for Nigeria (HFN) held a free medical outreach at Araromi Community, Elebu Oja, Ibadan, Oyo State.

The program offered residents free consultations, health education, and essential medications, ensuring access to vital healthcare services.

Key focus areas included:

- Blood pressure checks
- Blood sugar testing
- Malaria screening
- General health assessments
- Personalized health counseling

A total of over 20 residents participated in the outreach. The community members expressed their deep appreciation for the initiative and highlighted the need for more regular medical checks and health education sessions to support their long-term well-being.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH



Community Health Engagement – Merry Land International Church, Oghareki, Delta State

On August 31, 2025, Health for Nigeria (HFN) had the privilege of hosting a community health engagement at Merry Land International Church, Oghareki, Delta State.

The session began with an engaging health talk on the importance of regular medical checkups and a focus on the causes and prevention of stroke—a condition that silently affects many in our communities. Chew Joy Amadin emphasized how small, consistent lifestyle choices can significantly reduce the risk of life-threatening illnesses.

Following the talk, blood pressure checks were conducted for church members. Several individuals were found to have elevated readings without prior awareness of their condition. Their names and vital signs were carefully documented and shared with the church pastor for appropriate follow-up and clinical referral.

The engagement not only raised vital awareness but also highlighted the life-saving importance of regular health monitoring. Church members warmly received the initiative, while the leadership expressed sincere gratitude to HFN for the support and commitment to community health.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH



Community Health Engagement – Erin Ijesa & Iresi, Osun State

On September 3, 2025, HFN conducted two impactful community health sessions. In Erin Ijesa, Nurse Adesanmi engaged with the chiefs on blood pressure management and prostate health awareness. Blood pressure checks were carried out, and participants with elevated readings were counseled and referred for follow-up care.

Meanwhile, at Baptist High School, Iresi, Adeniyi Folake led an engagement with the Hairdresser Zone A Association, attended by 35 participants. Discussions centered on malaria prevention and hypertension awareness. Two individuals with high blood pressure readings were identified and advised to seek immediate medical attention.

Both communities expressed gratitude, underscoring the importance of HFN's grassroots health interventions in raising awareness and saving lives.
